I can only continue to advise that this is selfish and unacceptable, and if a fire broke out during the time it is unattended, a catastrophic fire could result with so much pastoral land around us. To those who did this, please bear that in mind next year and wait until we reopen. This is a wonderful resource that saves a lot of expensive trips to the dump and we don't want Council to force us to close it down as they would, if we do not manage it safely.


