The Memorial Wall

In November last year Council granted permission to use the Lookout stone wall as a Memorial Wall for the placing of plaques honouring the memory of those who have passed on, and who were associated with Port Julia.

There are strict guidelines required by Council, and the PJPA is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of the location. In December a small number of volunteers undertook a tidy up and repaint of rails, shelter shed and seat.

The purchase, manufacture and placement of all plaques will be administered solely by McQueen Funerals and an order and payment form is attached.

The plaques may take up to three months to appear on the wall, depending on work load and availability, so patience will be required after an order is placed. Payment must be received by McQueen Funerals before the order is completed -, bank details are on the order form.

Campground Shade Structure



We now have an additional structure adjacent to the BBQ Shed that is covered in shade cloth, and which allows more campers to gather for their happy hours in comfort.

Rainwater Tanks

It has been drawn to our attention that E.coli has been detected in a rainwater sample taken recently in Port Julia. It may be prudent to have your water tested, especially if you drink the water that comes straight off your roof without being filtered, or having the water first flush diverted before entering the tanks.

Bird droppings on the roof being washed into the gutters and downpipes, and tanks are strongly suspected of being the source of the contamination.

Approved water testers can be found in the Yellow Pages, and include The Australian Water Quality Centre in Victoria Square Adelaide.
